Introduction

Te Māngai Pāho is committed to supporting the Māori media and music sectors and collectively improving the outcomes of the Maihi Karauna, the Crown's strategy for Māori language revitalisation.

Te Pūtake

Purpose

This funding opportunity will support reputable music organisations to host collaborative song writing sessions to develop popular contemporary waiata reo Māori. Proposed collaborations should aim to grow the confidence and capability of New Zealanders to write reo Māori songs in popular genres. Focus should be on completing lyrics, song structures and melodies, and recording songs to studio demo level. The expectation is that demos will be polished later, to release standard, and made available to the public before June 30, 2023.

This funding is aligned to Te Māngai Pāho's 'Creation' performance expectations.

Request for Proposals

This RFP invites music organisations with a track record for funding to apply to support the set up and delivery of collaborative songwriting sessions. Proposals should present a fully developed programme with clear deliverables that will eventually lead to recording and release outcomes.

Proposals should be for sessions to be held between 1 October 2022 and 30 June 2023.

A total pool of \$160,000 (plus GST) will be made available for distribution but Te Māngai Pāho reserves the right to distribute a higher or lesser amount.

Only companies, trusts or another legal entity may apply. Individuals are ineligible.
