Te Māngai Pāho is committed to supporting the Māori media and music sectors that promote te reo Māori and Māori culture as a taonga under Te Tiriti o Waitangi.

Our role is to ensure te reo Māori, tikanga Māori and Māori culture is reflected in music. We work to build greater awareness and appreciation of te reo Māori, Māori values and practices across Aotearoa.

Purpose

This by-invitation contestable funding opportunity will support music organisations to celebrate and promote waiata reo Māori by way of strategic showcase.

This funding is aligned to Te Māngai Pāho's 'Audience' performance expectations.

Te Kaupapa Matua

Request for Proposals

This RFP invites **organisations*** with evidence of audience to apply for funding to support the delivery of a waiata reo Māori showcase that includes waiata reo Māori artists, performers and MCs.

A mātanga reo will be an integral part of your proposal, as they will ensure reo and tikanga is appropriate throughout.

Proposals should be for a showcase occurring 1 February 2022 to 30 June 2022.

A total pool of \$120,000 (plus GST) will be made available for distribution but Te Māngai Pāho reserves the right to distribute a higher or lesser amount in this funding round.

- Quality of proposed music programme and te reo Māori.
- Existing audience reach and audience potential.

Key Personnel (10%)

• Capability of key personnel and applicant to deliver professional outcomes.

Budget (10%)

• Realistic and reasonable budget for proposed output and outcomes.

Applying Online

You must be registered with Te Pūahatanga, the online application system operated by Te Māngai Pāho, to apply. You can register at any time, so we encourage first-time applicants to register well in advance of the funding deadline, 5:00pm **Friday 26 November 2021**. Only applications submitted through Te Pūahatanga portal will be considered.

Applicants can submit proposals when all the required application fields have been completed. You can start and save your application at any time throughout the process and come back to it via your dashboard prior to the deadline. Key compliance information from your registered provider data will automatically populate your funding application.
